

Introduction to the Word

Scripture

1 Peter 2:13-25

Reader

- 13 Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, 14 or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. 15 For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. 16 Live as free people, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil; live as God's slaves. 17 Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor.
- 18 Slaves, in reverent fear of God submit yourselves to your masters, not only to those who are good and considerate, but also to those who are harsh. 19 For it is commendable if someone bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because they are conscious of God. 20 But how is it to your credit if you receive a beating for doing wrong and endure it? But if you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. ²¹ For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps.
- ²² "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth."
- ²³ When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. 24 "He himself bore our sins" in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; "by his wounds you have been healed." 25 For "you were like sheep going astray," but now you have turned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

Community Group Questions

- 1) What are two things you've done today that upon reflection you see that part of your motivation was for those things to help you craft the identity you want to have? What do those things say about who you want to be? In what ways do you find the quest for identity energizing? In what ways is it demoralizing or burdensome?
- 2) What is said about Jesus in 1 Peter 2:4–10? What is said about believers? What connections can you draw between those two lists? What does that tell us about how we are to understand our identity?
- 3) According to 1 Peter 2:4–10, our connection to other believes is integral to our identity: we are being built together into a spiritual house. In this season of distancing and disconnection, what are two concrete things you can do as a community group to live out this identity of being connected to each other because you're connected to Jesus?

Children's questions:

Think of a favorite piece of clothing that you wear that says something about who you are. It could be a favorite shirt, or a cap with the logo of a favorite sports team, or a piece of jewelry that someone gave you. What does that piece of clothing say about you? How do you feel when you wear it? How do you think others perceive it?

Who we are—our identity—is complex. We usually base our identity off of what we do and how others see us. God says our identity is actually based on how he sees Jesus. Read 1 Peter 2:4 and 2:6. What does God think of Jesus? Now read 1 Peter 2:5. What does God think, therefore, of us? How can you believe that's really who you are?
