Community Group Questions

- 1) The construction of the tabernacle teaches that God values art in worship. How does liturgical art help us worship thoughtfully and expectantly? How does that apply for artists? How does that apply for those who don't consider themselves artists?
- 2) Read Isaiah 28:23–29. What does the farmer learn? How does he learn it? What does this tell us about God's means of teaching in our lives? How might it re-frame how you approach what you learn in your vocation and how you create beauty where you are?
- 3) How is Jesus' cross ugly? How is it beautiful? What do we learn about God and the gospel by thinking through this lens of beauty and art?

Children's Questions:

Think about a time recently when you were mad at somebody. How was that ugly? God's good news is that Jesus died for our sins to make everything beautiful again. How does Jesus' death have the power to take that time you were mad and turn it into something beautiful?

Call to Communion and Prayer

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please eat the bread privately, and then drink the cup together with us after everyone has returned to their seats. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to partake of Communion.

The ministry of prayer is one of the ways we live together as a community of believers and seekers. During Communion, members of our prayer team are available at the front of the sanctuary. It would be our privilege to pray with you as we walk together through the joys and struggles of life. We also encourage you to pray with one another in the pews during this time of movement in our service.

How We Welcome

As we work towards living out our mission of helping connect people to Jesus, the way we welcome people into life at Redeemer is a big part of that. How are we removing barriers to the Gospel? That's something we have to ask ourselves. We want everyone who walks through our doors to be quickly connected. We want them to feel wanted. We want them to be in-the-know.

If you've gone to Redeemer any amount of time, you know that some of the things that make this place unique can be barriers to a newcomer. Where do you park? How do you navigate this building? Where are the restrooms?

What we've done

In the last year, we've done some cool things that have helped! At our new Welcome Table, visitors can get connected to a member of our Welcome Team and learn about things that are happening in the life of the church. (They even get a bag of Tinker coffee as a way to say, "Hey, we're glad you visited us today!") Have you noticed the big blue wayfinding signs? We had a team of consultants come and work with us on how to make our building more easy-to-navigate, and those signs have played a big part in that.

What's coming

We're constantly thinking through ways to improve all of these things. Our goal for 2020 is to roll out a new parking system, with parking wayfinding signs and a parking team. We'll be recruiting people to be a concierge team for guests, helping them with things like finding where to take their kids, getting a donut, finding the restrooms, and answering questions they may have. We'd also like to have hosts in the Harrison Gallery during the middle hour: smiling faces that will help that space be warm and inviting to someone who may be visiting alone or for their first time.

You have a role to play

If you call Redeemer home, we hope you'll find a place to serve. As we launch the Parking, Concierge, and Host teams, think about how you could serve in one of those roles. We need people who can help families sign their kids in on a Sunday morning. We need people who will hold umbrellas and walk with guests from our parking lots into the building. We need people who have a heart for hospitality and helping people feel welcome.


