Reader

For if you have suffered in the body for Christ, you have finished with sin. ² You won't spend the rest of your lives chasing your own desires, but you will be anxious to do the will of God. ³ You have had enough in the past of the evil things that godless people enjoy—their immorality and lust, their feasting and drunkenness and wild parties, and their terrible worship of idols. ⁴ Of course, your former friends are surprised when you no longer plunge into the flood of wild and destructive things they do. So they slander you. ⁵ But remember that they will have to face God, who stands ready to judge everyone, both the living and the dead. ⁶ That is why the Good News was preached to those who are now dead—so although they were destined to die like all people, they now live forever with God in the Spirit.

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Community Group Questions

- 1) One of the big questions Peter's audience would've been asking is, "Is following Jesus worth it?" Is it worth the tension it creates with people we love? Is it worth the struggle of saying "no" to things we sometimes want to say "yes" to? Can you think of 1-2 ways following Jesus has placed you out of step with friends, neighbors, or people in your family? And what has that looked like to navigate?
- 2) In verse 1, Peter claims that those who experience suffering out of obedience to Jesus are "finished with sin" (i.e., that sin has lost the influence it once held over our hearts; we're sick of it, we don't want it anymore). How does a willingness to suffer show the power of Jesus at work in our lives? What are some examples of ways you've seen this play out (in yourself or in others)?
- 3) How does Christ's willingness to suffer for us (verse 1) impact how you read the rest of the passage? What does the self-giving love of Jesus say about God's will for us (verse 2), and how might that be better than "chasing our own desires"?

Call to Communion and Prayer

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews (in a socially distanced way).
