Community Group Questions

- 1) What's your level of want for God's Word? What holds you back from wanting God's Word? What do you desire, day to day, in the moment, instead of, or more than, God's Word?
- 2) Psalm 1:5–6 looks to future judgment and heaven. How does that wider horizon re-frame how we approach God's Word? How does Jesus as God's Word fulfill the promises of 1:5–6? How might Jesus re-shape our heart, therefore, for God's Word?
- 3) Where have you seen the hope and truth of Psalm 1:2–3, that a person who delights in God's Word and lives by it, flourishes? Where has that been true for you? For others whom you know? How can those models cultivate our desire for God's Word?

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews (in a socially distanced way).
