Community Group Questions

- 1. How does Zacchaeus need to be rescued by the gospel? (Be specific) How does the crowd, based on what they say in v.7, need to be rescued by the gospel? (Be specific) How do you need to be rescued by the gospel right now? (Be specific)
- 2. Our first core value as a church is the transforming safety of the gospel. How do "transforming" and "safety" relate? Why does the safety of the gospel allow for, indeed lead to, transformation by the gospel?
- 3. How does Zacchaeus experience transformation from the safety of the gospel? How possibly could the crowd experience transformation from the safety of the gospel? How possibly could you in this season experience transformation from the safety of the gospel? Or to put it another way, where might the Spirit be at work to move you forward in being transformed into the image of Jesus by the good news of Jesus?

Children's Question

Maybe you've heard that Zacchaeus was a "wee little man." We can see it in our imagination as this short man climbs a tree to see Jesus, only to be surprised by Jesus looking up and inviting himself over for dinner! Why did Zacchaeus need Jesus? Why does the grumbling crowd need Jesus? Why do you need Jesus?

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.

There are also so many things that fill my heart with hope and many things that draw me to you, and I want to put my trust in you. Keep my heart from self-deception. Protect me from any evil misleading or binding spirits. Calm my fears. Soften my cynicism.
