

## **Additional Text**

# **Community Group Questions**

Break Some Ice: Think about a good meal you've shared with others. What was the most enjoyable part of that meal for you? What do you think Jesus enjoyed most in his many meals with others?

- 1. As a tax collector, Levi (Matthew) was universally despised and hated. To his own people, he was a sellout, excommunicated from their social and religious life. To his Roman occupiers, he was a person to be exploited. These things did not keep Levi from being seen and called by Jesus. What does this tell us about the love that Jesus has for us?
- 2. Levi isn't the only person in this story who needs Jesus. The Pharisees also needed his call to pierce their hearts. Unfortunately, their religious code had become a boundary that emphasized keeping others out rather than inviting others into God's presence. Reflect for a moment on the way this instinct may show itself in your own heart. Who are the people/groups you separate yourself from? Who are you quick to judge or show contempt toward? If you're willing, share some of this with your group as an opportunity to pray for one another.
- Read Isaiah 53:4-6 together. How does the gospel tell us that Jesus heals us of our sin sickness?
- 4. Levi left everything to follow Jesus. His immediate response was to throw a great feast so that his friends would get to meet Jesus too. Levi's newfound joy both changed his orientation toward his "stuff," and it gave him the desire to tell others about Jesus. How do you see gospel joy at work in your life? Encourage each other with one or two ways Jesus has given you new and lasting joy.

## **Call to Communion**

#### Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
