

Community Group Questions

- 1. Take a minute to read Luke 24:1-12. How would you describe some of the reactions Luke records here? Are there any that you resonate with? If you put yourselves in their shoes, how might you respond to the news of Jesus' empty tomb?
- 2. In verse 5, two angels ask the women, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" It's almost as if the angels think the disciples should've expected Jesus' resurrection. Why did the angels think this? And why was it so hard for the disciples to believe?
- 3. These verses highlight both the faithfulness of Jesus and the forgetfulness of his followers. Jesus makes good on all of his promises, but he also has patience towards those who aren't sure how to take him. How does the resurrection shape the way you understand Jesus? If all of these things are true, do you find him more trustworthy, powerful, or confusing as a result?

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
