Reader

When the festival on the day of Pentecost was finishing, all the believers were meeting together in one place. 
- ¹ In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."
- ⁶ Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"
- ⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."
- ⁹ After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.
- ¹⁰ They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹ "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Community Group Questions

- 1. Take a minute to read Acts 1:1-11 again. What stands out as you look at these verses? How would you summarize what the author seems to say?
- 2. Acts begins as a sequel to Luke's gospel. While Luke's "former book" was about what Jesus "began to do and teach" (Acts 1:1), the second is about what Jesus continues to do in the church-through the gift of the Holy Spirit, and our call to be Christ's "witnesses" (Acts 1:8). What do you think it means to be a "witness" of Jesus? What does this calling look like practically? Is there anything about this calling that seems difficult or unclear? And does the Holy Spirit fit into what Jesus says here?
- 3. How do we live out this calling today? What do you think it looks like to "bear witness" to Jesus in the context of our workplaces, neighborhoods, households, or community? And how might God's grace empower us for this work? Take some time to brainstorm about what this can look like either individually or as a group.

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.


