Community Group Questions

1. *The Bible can be straightforward and strange. Read Zechariah 1:7-17. How do you feel about passages like this with its vision in the night, unusual imagery, and angels? What role do passages like this play in your faith? What does it mean that this part of Scripture has life-giving authority?*
2. *Jealousy doesn't have a good reputation. How is our jealousy usually a sign that we're being worldly (read 1 Corinthians 3:1-4)? What is the sin underneath the sin in this kind of jealousy? What's different about God's jealousy? Read 2 Corinthians 11:1-4. Paul is talking about his own attitude, but it reflects God's attitude. Why is such jealousy a good thing? How does that shape how we understand and relate to God?*
3. *How does the "unveiling" in this passage, that is, how this vision pulls back the curtain and shows what really is going on, affect how you trust God? What could that tell you about how you look at your normal life? How can it re-shape your faith in God in the midst of your upcoming week?*

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
