Community Group Questions

- 1. Let's be honest. There's a lot of stuff that probably feels a bit strange in Zechariah 3:1–10. Take a moment to read the text again, and discuss these things together as a group. What stands out? What strikes you as odd? Why do you think these things stand out the way they do?
- 2. The reality of Satan probably isn't something we spend much time thinking about. Throughout the Bible (e.g., Revelation 12:10, Zechariah 3), Satan is presented as "the accuser"—one who points out our sins, highlights our flaws, and tries to cast doubt on the love of God for his people. When you think about your life, your thinking, your self-talk, etc, how might the presence of this accuser help you make sense of your experience?
- 3. Part of what makes these accusations painful is that many of them are true. And yet through the work of Jesus, God takes our "filthy garments" and clothes us with the righteousness of Christ. How does this reality help us live with both honesty and hope? What difference does knowing Jesus make when we hear the voice of the accuser?

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will eccive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
