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Community Group Questions

1. *God's word—sometimes—is shocking, and these two visions from Zechariah certainly fall into that category. What are we to make of this? For what purposes might God have communicated to Zechariah and to us in this way? What might this say about God? What might this say about us?*
2. *In what ways have you experienced God's hope amidst the defeat of sin as related to that which we see God doing here in the text (covering over and carrying away our sin) and/or perhaps as related to other examples not directly related to this text?*
3. *Many times, when we read God's word, there is not a clear action for us to do or a direct step for us to take (and that is quite all right, by the way). With that said, it's hard to make a case, though, for one to read scripture and not to have a response. So, as this may be one of those passages, in what ways might you be led to respond to what we have read?*

Children's Questions

1. *For those of you who participated in an Easter egg hunt this past weekend, what were some things that you found in your basket? What did Zechariah find in his basket in the vision?*
2. *What emotion might Zechariah have felt when he saw what was inside this basket, especially knowing that it represented the wickedness and sin of all the people, including you and me?*
3. *Now, how might Zechariah have felt knowing that God carried away this basket and the sin that was inside? Do you know that Jesus does this for us (cf. 1 John 3:5)? How does this make you feel? How might you respond to this great thing that God does for you?*

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
