Community Group Questions

1. *The image of the high priest Joshua being crowned points forward to Jesus being both our king and our high priest. (You can read Hebrews 7 for an explanation of what this looks like.) Why is it important that Jesus fulfills both the role of king and the role of priest?*
2. *Zechariah 6 tells us that, “Those who are far off shall come and help to build the temple of the Lord.” Read Ephesians 2:11-22 where Paul picks up on this language. We are included as those who were far off from God. Because of that, what do you think it looks like for modern Christians to “help build the temple of the Lord?”*
3. *Take some time to reflect on the fact that we were once far off from God, but he sent Jesus to bring us into his family. What does that say about the character of God?*

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.
