The familiarity of a handrail or a rocking chair, a tile floor, a crack in the sidewalk can take us back in time, give us a sense of place, or keep us grounded. These banners themselves are a tiny crack into small places and things that matter to big meaningful lives—and remind us to reconnect, engage, and to be present and intentional in the spaces we inhabit.

Notes

- 1. Where have you faced discouragement over not having much to show for your efforts in your faith? You've put the effort in, done what God has called you to do, and it doesn't have much impact. Maybe it's in fighting sin or serving in a specific ministry or studying the Bible or sharing your faith. What effect did it have on what you believe about who God is? What effect did it have on whether to keep going when you weren't seeing the results that you had hoped for?
- 2. How does the realism of the Bible—particularly expressed in Haggai 2:3 that yes, what they've built so far does seem like nothing—how does that realism help you face into the hardships and setbacks in life? Why are we sometimes scared to acknowledge when we don't have much to show for our efforts? Why is the Bible willing to call things what they are in ways that we stumble over?
- 3. Which of the encouragements in Haggai 2:1–9 about what God has done and what God will do particularly resonate for you? How can these truths about his character and actions strengthen you to work at what he's called you to?
