Advent Letter

from 2 Peter 3:1-13

Reader Dear friends, this is now my second letter to you. I have written both of them as reminders to wake you up to clear thinking. I want you to remember the words spoken in the past by the holy prophets and the commandment our Lord and Savior spoken through your apostles.

Above all, you must understand that in the last days mockers will come, making fun of the truth while they are being led by their own evil want. They will say, "Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our ancestors died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation."

But because of their hard hearts it escapes their notice that though long ago by God's word the heavens came into being and the earth was formed out of water and by water, it was also through these waters that the world of that time was deluged and destroyed. Moreover, by God's word the present heavens and earth are reserved for fire, stored up for the day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly.

So dear friends, do not let this escape your notice:

The Lord experiences one day with all the intricacy of a thousand years, and a thousand years he grasps as only a day. The Lord is not careless in keeping his promise, as some have interpreted. Instead he is enduringly patient with you, not wanting anyone to be destroyed, but everyone to come to repentance.

Still the day of the Lord will come, like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.

Since everything will come undone in this way, what kind of people must you become? Your daily manner of life must be treated as sacred to the Lord and full of reverence as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the undoing of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

Luke 1:5-25

Reader

⁵ In the time of Herod king of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife Elizabeth was also a descendant of Aaron.
⁶ Both of them were righteous in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commands and decrees blamelessly. ⁷ But they were childless because Elizabeth was not able to conceive, and they were both very old.

⁸ Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, ⁹ he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. ¹⁰ And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshipers were praying outside.

¹¹ Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. ¹² When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. ¹³ But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. ¹⁴ He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born. ¹⁶ He will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. ¹⁷ And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."

¹⁸ Zechariah asked the angel, "How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years."

¹⁹ The angel said to him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. ²⁰ And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their appointed time."

²¹ Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he stayed so long in the temple. ²² When he came out, he could not speak to them. They realized he had seen a vision in the temple, for he kept making signs to them but remained unable to speak.

²³ When his time of service was completed, he returned home. ²⁴ After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion. ²⁵ "The Lord has done this for me," she said. "In these days he has shown his favor and taken away my disgrace among the people."

Notes

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Community Group Questions

- 1. How does Luke frame his narrative of Zechariah and Elizabeth such that it "rhymes" with the story of Old Testament (particularly Abraham and Sarah)? What does it mean that the Gospel story stands in continuity with what came before? Why does this matter? How is Jesus both the fulfillment of history and the hope of the future?
- 2. Zechariah has an experience of the unseen, spiritual world breaking in to the seen and material world. During the Advent/Christmas season, our culture seems to have a heightened desire for an unseen, better, more beautiful world to break into our own. How does the promise of John's birth bring these desires to the surface? How does Christ "break in" and bring this beauty to fruition now? In your life? Our City? The Nations?
- 3. Our expectation as the story progresses is that the righteous priest will be the hero of the story. When Zechariah is made mute for his unbelief, while Elizabeth quickly believes, Luke turns our expectations upside down. How does this reversal set up our expectations for who Jesus will be and what he will do? How is the simple necessity of faith an encouragement or challenge to you?

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.

I am confused by the fact that there are so many things that I don't understand or that make me angry about you. There are also so many things that fill my heart with hope and many things that draw me to you, and I want to put my trust in you. God, you say I can come to you and ask for anything, so if you are real, please give me the faith I need to believe. Give me the desire to continue to seek after you. Keep my heart from self-deception. Protect me from any evil misleading or binding spirits. Calm my fears. Soften my cynicism. Be patient with me, and if you are God, please don't let me go, but instead let me know that you are real. I have a little faith, help me in my doubt.
