ACT I: WHO IS THIS CHILD?

Lesson 1

from Genesis 3:14-15

Reader

After the splendor of creation, when humanity had a free and joyful fellowship with God, Adam and Eve were tempted away with the promise of their own independent understanding. They believed what made sense to them, doubted the one who made them and loved them and through that one choice they brought into the world a spiritual disease that has affected all of us who have been born since. A deceiver and accuser in the form of a serpent was the one who had come and infected their minds with distrust. When they had eaten the lie, they felt shame and they judged themselves for the first time, realizing they were not ok, that they were no longer at rest or whole. So God came and found them and when they confessed what had happened and how the serpent had deceived them, God turned to the serpent and spoke:

"Because you have done this, you are cursed more than all animals, domestic and wild. You will crawl on your belly, groveling in the dust as long as you live.

And I will cause hostility between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring. Her child will strike your head, and you will strike his heel."

But who this child would be, how he would strike the serpent's head, when he would come, how long they would have to live in the brokenness they had created, neither Adam nor Eve nor even the serpent had any idea. Only that God was promising to make things right through a child.

Lesson 3 from 2 Samuel 7:11-13

Reader

A thousand years later, Abraham's descendants are a nation and their King, David, was looking to establish God's full honor and glory on the earth. He wanted to build a permanent temple for God because at that time God's worship was still happening in a tent. When God responds to his desire for this, he tells him that David's son will build the temple and he tells him that the promised child will come in the form of a King, one of David's sons and yet this king would be eternal. He says:

"The LORD declares to you that the LORD himself will establish a house for you: When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your child to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and I will establish his kingdom. He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

So David's son Solomon did become king after him and did build a temple, but that kingdom fell and so did the temple he built. But God, who cannot lie, was pointing to a different kind of king, who would build the true eternal temple.

Lesson 5

from Luke 1:26-56

Reader

Hundreds of years later, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

Reader

The night Jesus was born was not special at all. Here was the promised eternal King who was God and human coming to save all of us from our broken sadness and there was no earthquake, no voice from heaven, just a normal night for everyone in the world. That is, except for a few blue collar shepherds, working through the night. It was to them that God made known the secret that he was planning for the whole world.

That night there were shepherds staying in the fields nearby, guarding their flocks of sheep. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared among them, and the radiance of the Lord's glory surrounded them. They were terrified, but the angel reassured them. "Don't be afraid!" he said. "I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people. The Savior—yes, the Messiah, the Lord—has been born today in Bethlehem, the city of David! And you will recognize him by this sign: You will find a baby wrapped snugly in strips of cloth, lying in a manger."
